

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION General Education Requirement (May 2021)

In addition to the 33.0 credits of core business courses, students are required to complete an additional 27.0 credits of general education in order to earn their BBA degree. Most elective courses will be 3.0 credits, and may be met with lower or upper-level university courses. The category requirements and their subjects are as follows:

- 6.0 credits Social Science or Humanities (SSCI)
- 9.0 credits Unspecified credits**** (UNSP)

Unless otherwise listed below, Business courses (eg. BUSA, MTKG, OPMT, HRMG, FMGT) will only fulfil your Unspecified electives. Courses that fall outside of the above subjects can be reviewed for transfer credit upon request.

Courses may be taken at any recognized post-secondary institute in Canada, and must be academic, university-level courses with final exams or major individual written projects. Students may contact the Program Administrator at <u>bba@bcit.ca</u> to determine if a course taken outside of BCIT is acceptable.
