

Bachelor of Accounting General Education Elective Requirements

In addition to the 24.0 credits of advanced technical specialty courses, students are required to complete an additional 36.0 credits of general education courses to earn a Bachelor of Accounting degree.

General Education Elective Requirements (36.0 credits)

Required Courses: (6.0 credits):

- 3.0 credits: LIBS 7001: Critical Reading and Writing
- 3.0 credits: Applied Ethics course such as LIBS 7002 or an alternate Applied Ethics course

The remaining general education course requirements (30.0 credits) may be met with lower or upper-level post-secondary courses in the following subject areas:

- 6.0 credits: Social Sciences or Humanities
- 9.0 credits: Arts or Science
- 15.0 credits: Unspecified

Other BCIT courses not listed below may be eligible in consultation with the Program Area and the Registrar's Office. Courses with S and U grading are not eligible for general education. No vocational or technical studies courses will be considered for general education.

- The level of the course
- The number of transferable credits available for the course
