Introduction

The Nomination & Application Process

If you are interested in attending the BCIT School of Construction and the Environment, you must contact your home institution's international exchange office to nominate you. Your home institution will be able to tell you about its selection procedure and start you on the application process. Our current partner schools are:

Once your school has approved your nomination to apply, fill out and send in the BCIT <u>application</u> form.

Learning Agreements / Course Registration

Exchange students need to complete a learning agreement (also known as a Course Registration form) which outlines the specific courses they will be taking in their semester abroad. Make sure to complete this before coming to BCIT. This agreement allows you to receive credits at your home institution for the courses you completed at BCIT. We will be happy to help you and your home institution throughout the application and course selection process.

Our Academic School Year

BCIT's semesters/terms are Fall and Winter/Spring. They run:

- Fall September to December
- Winter/Spring January to May
 - o students enjoy spring break for one week in the middle of March each year

Accommodation

Indicate your housing preferences on your application form. You are eligible to live in the Maquinna residence if you have been accepted into a full-time program that is four months duration or longer. Find out more about life in residence and how to apply on the BCIT Student Housing website.

Coming to Canada

Visa and Study Permits

One term/semester

International students studying in Canada for one semester (less than 6 months) require proof of a visitor's visa to be allowed to enter Canada. No study permit is required as long as you abide by Citizenship and Immigration Canada IRCC regulations.

Two terms/semesters

International students who will study in Canada for six months or longer require a study permit/ student visa. Applying for a study permit may take between three weeks and six months, depending on the workload of the embassy, and if you require a medical examination.

Medical Insurance

All students require medical insurance when living in Canada and studying at BCIT. The International Student Centre (ISC) assists with arranging your application for medical Insurance. Arrival

Upon arrival at <u>Vancouver International Airport (YVR)</u>, there are several options to travel to your destination.

<u>Skytrain:</u> Canada Line Sky Train is centrally located between the International and Domestic Terminals, and very easy to find. Once through the customs and immigration arrivals process, walk toward the

exit to the International Arrivals Greeting Area. Exit the building following signs marked **Canada Line**. Before the parkade entrance, an escalator and elevator will take you up to the Canada Line platform

<u>Taxi:</u> Once through the customs and immigration process, you'll enter the International Arrivals Greeting Area. Walk outside the building on the same level and look for the taxi stand.

<u>Pick up:</u> Upon availability, you may connect with a student mentor to pick you up.

Banking

Should you wish to open a Canadian bank account, you typically need two pieces of identification such as a student ID card, valid passport, or a driver's license. Metro Vancouver Location

Greater Vancouver encompasses the city of Vancouver and its many surrounding municipalities. It includes Burnaby (where BCIT is located), which is approximately 30 minutes away by public transit from downtown Vancouver. The city is surrounded by forests, mountains, and the Pacific Ocean. It rests on Canada's West Coast, in the province of British Columbia.

Climate

Vancouver is in Canada's warmest weather zone. Monthly weather trends ca be found at <u>Burnaby</u>, <u>British Columbia - Monthly Calendar - The Weather Network</u>. Jan – Mar will be typically between 7 – 10 °C.

In Burnaby, it is rare that it will snow. If it does, it usually melts in a day or two. But don't despair; the area offers a world of recreational opportunities! We boast being mild enough for sailing during the day and offer world-class skiing at night. For those interested in participating in snow activities, there
