

BSN – Specialty Nursing General Education Electives Requirement

The six credits of General Education electives must be from subject areas outside the core academic discipline (Nursing), in at least two different academic disciplines. The electives can be at a first-year academic level or higher.

BCIT's Liberal Studies Electives (LIBS 7XXX) meet the General Education electives requirement with the **exception** of LIBS 7001 and LIBS 7021. These two courses (or equivalent courses) cannot be used as general education electives.

Non-BCIT courses eligible to receive credit as General Education electives must be:

- academic in nature
- transferable into a recognized Canadian degree program
- taken at a recognized public post-secondary educational institution in Canada.
- check the BC Transfer of Credit Guide to ensure equivalency of non-BCIT courses: http://www.bctransferguide.ca
- An International Credential Evaluation Service (ICES) report must be submitted for any courses taken outside of Canada. http://www.bcit.ca/ices/

Courses <u>not eligible</u> for credit are:

- Nursing courses
- Psychology and Sociology 100 level
- Human Biology or Anatomy & Physiology
- Courses with S and U grading
- Vocational or Technical studies courses
