Panel Bios (5 panelists)

1. **Ellen Wasan** is a Faculty member, Dept. of Basic Health Sciences, and an Adjunct Professor, UBC. Ellen has over 25 peer-review publications, many abstracts, several book chapters and 4 patents, most of which represent collaborations with biotechnology companies in some form.

- 2. **Bruno Jaggi** is a faculty member in the Biomedical Engineering Technology Program at BCIT as well as an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Chemical and Biological Engineering at the University of British Columbia. Bruno was the co-founder, Senior Vice President and Chief Engineer at Xillix Technologies., a medical device company. He has done research at the BC Cancer Agency, and has served as a board member on several medical device companies providing expertise in medical device development and research.
- 3. **Meena Amlani** is a Faculty member, Medical Radiography Program, BCIT. Meena is currently undertaking a Doctorate of Health Sciences with a focus on e-learning in Medical Radiography.
- 4. **Helen Heacock** is a Faculty member in the Environmental Health Program, BCIT. Helen teaches epidemiology, research methodology, risk assessment, and ergonomics. Helen was a co-investigator in the "**Development and evaluation of an affordable lift device**" conducted by BCIT a few years ago.
