The BCIT Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Reports presents summary results from the annual survey of BCIT apprentices, administered approximately one year after completion of their final level. The reports combine the last three years of available survey results for 2023, 2024 and 2025. The survey results, downloaded from the BC Student Outcomes SharePoint website are organized into three-page program summaries. Each contains information on apprentices' labour market experiences and their opinions regarding their education. The purpose of this document is to give prospective BCIT students important reference information.

Survey Overview

Each year, BCIT and all other publicly-funded universities, colleges and institutes in BC survey their apprenticeship completers approximately one year after their program completion. This survey is the main source of information on apprenticeship completers' employment experiences and their opinions regarding their educational experiences. The Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Survey has existed since 2005.

The province publishes a series of reports annually, detailing survey results by program at the Provincial level. The reports group together similar programs offered at other BC universities, colleges and institutes. So, although those reports are useful, information for specific BCIT programs is masked. In fact, readers should note that not all current BCIT apprentice programs listed in the calendar will have summaries in this book, as it takes at least one year before graduates of new programs are surveyed and then included in the BCIT Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Reports.

How is the information organized?

The BCIT Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Reports presents specific BCIT program results for former students who have completed the final level of their technical training. The survey results reported are from questions that focus on describing apprentices' labour market experiences. Whenever possible, three years of combined survey data are presented for each program.

The program survey results are presented using a three-page layout, with the displayed information oriented towards reporting apprentices' labour market experiences (after final level completion). Each apprentice program's survey results are presented on their own pages, with the summaries themselves grouped by School.

The BCIT Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Reports are specifically designed to be a key reference for prospective students who are in the process of making their program choices. As such, these reports display a summary of the survey's labour market results, skill development and college experience, as well as further studies after completing the program.

How to Interpret This Report

Each Spring, the Apprenticeship Student Outcomes Survey is conducted by telephone. For the three years of available survey data reported in this book, the following table identifies the apprenticeship cohort associated with each of the survey years, the number of apprentices initially surveyed, the number who responded, and the response rate.

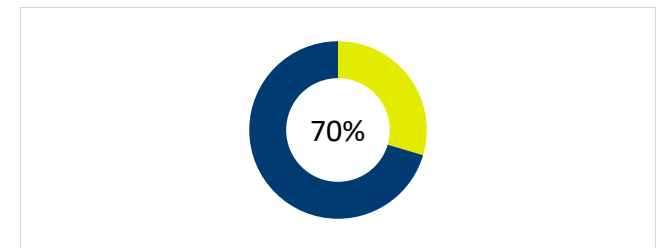

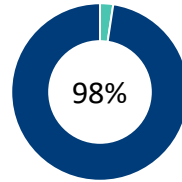
Employment Outcomes

In Labour Force



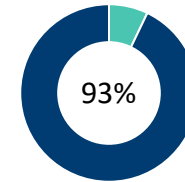

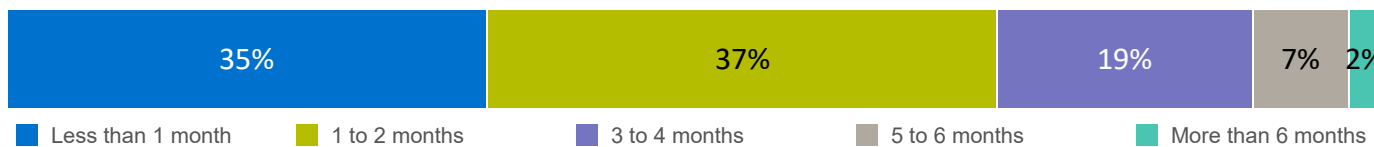

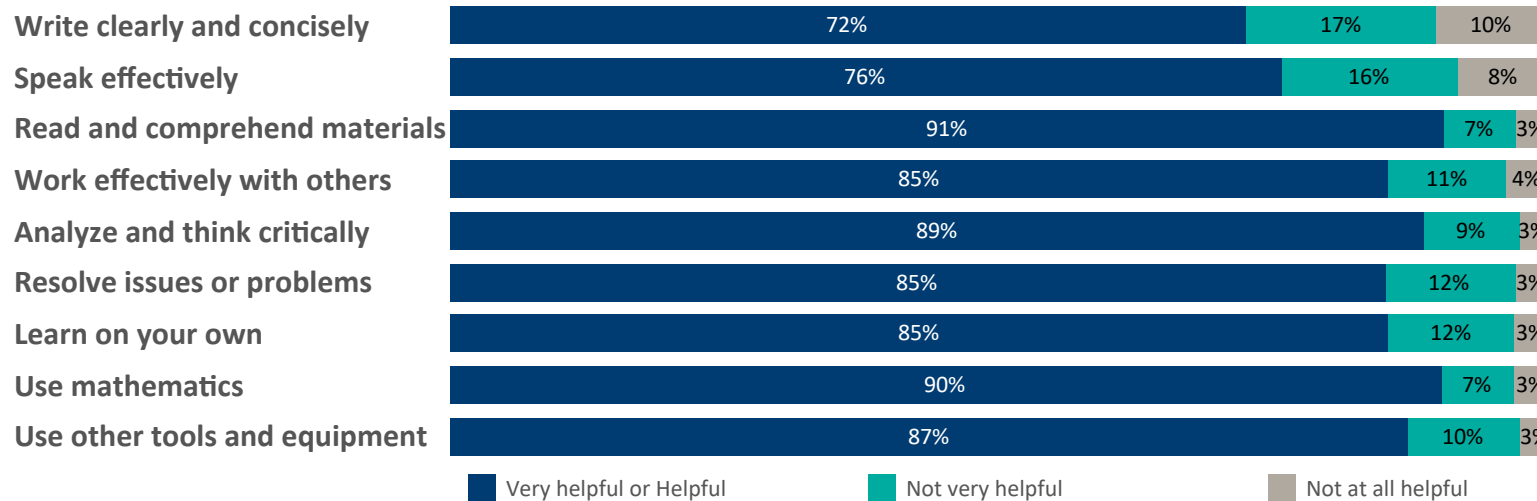

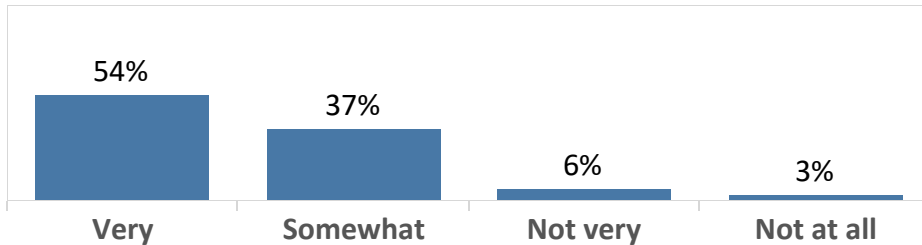

How useful have the knowledge and skills you gained from your program been in preparing you to write the TQ, CQ, or Interprovincial Red Seal certification examination?

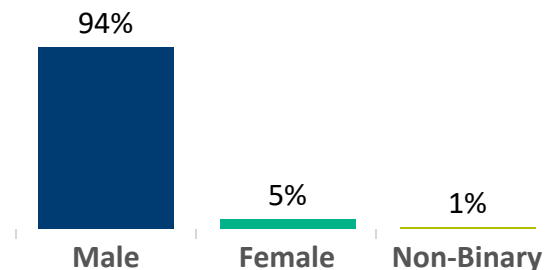

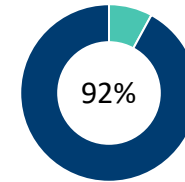

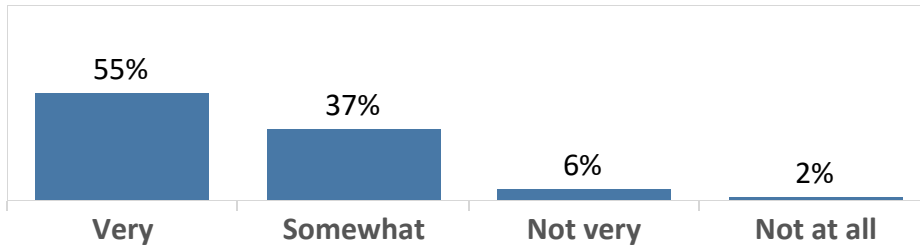

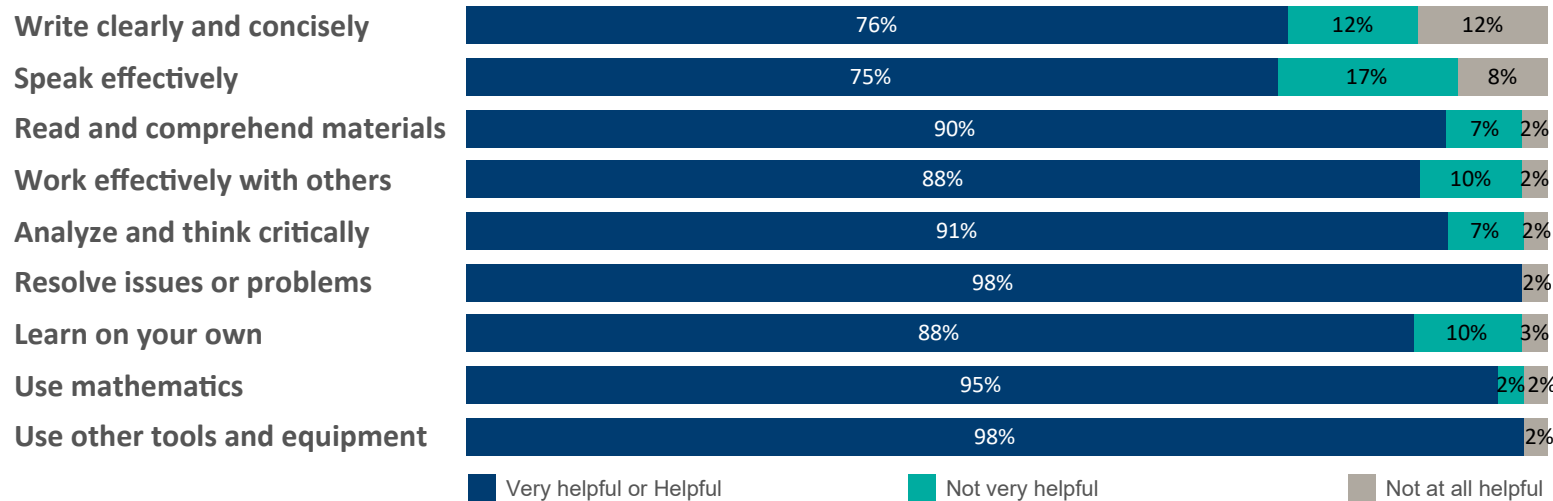

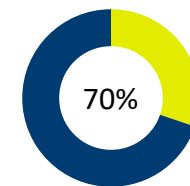

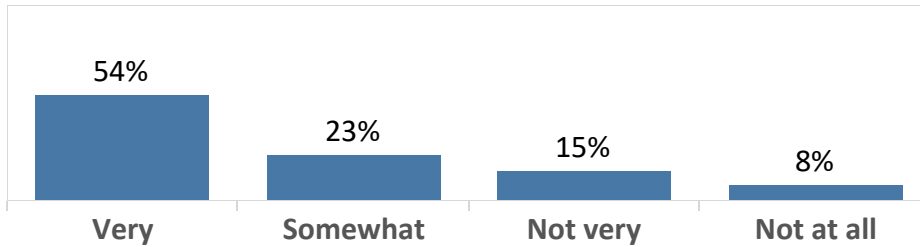

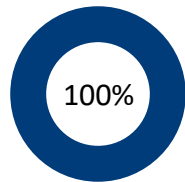

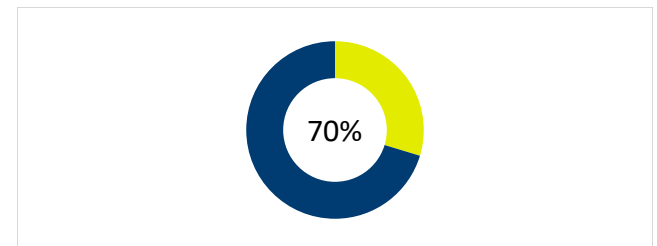

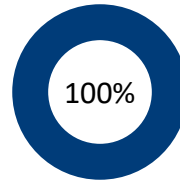

In Labour Force



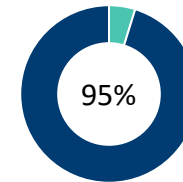

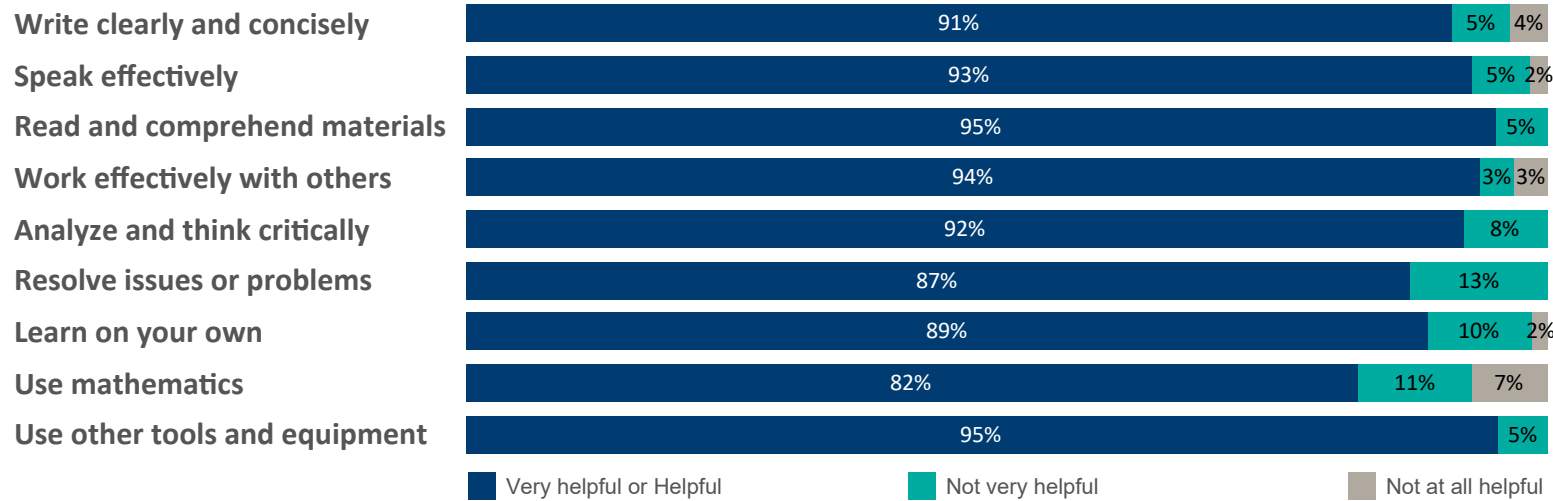

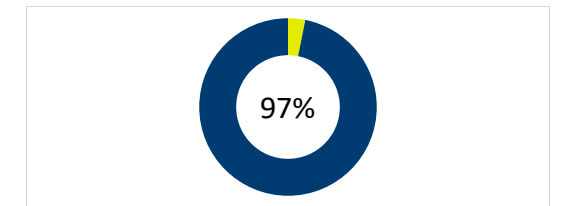

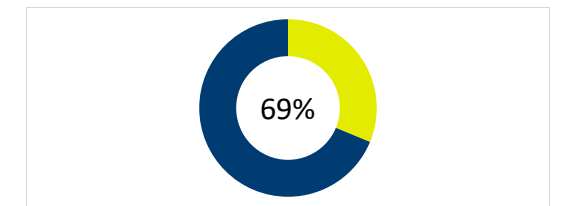

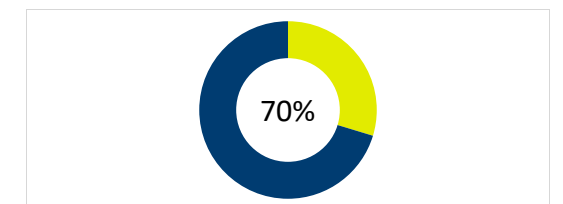

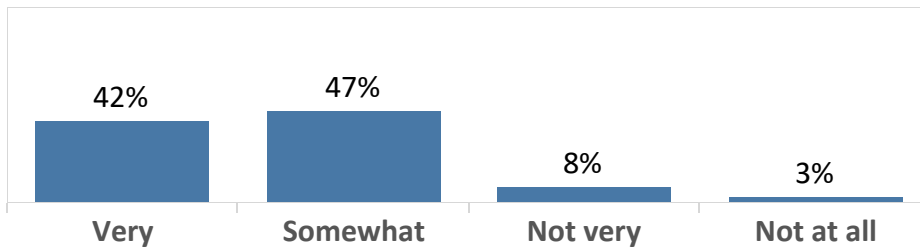

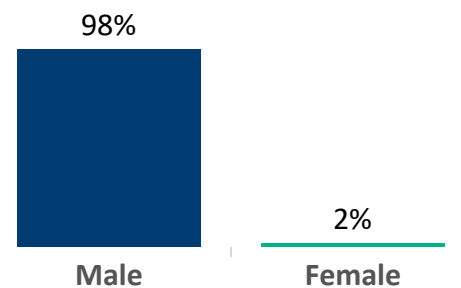
