# Bring life to your writing: active vs. passive voice

#### **Active voice**

Make the active voice your default mode of writing. In the active voice, the subject of the sentence performs the action. A sentence in the active voice is direct and clear.

### **Example**

subject — action
performs the action
The mail carriers distribute the advertising circulars.

#### **Passive voice**

In the passive voice, the subject of the sentence receives the action. Sentences in the passive voice are dull and more difficult to understand. They are also a major source of wordiness. Restrict your use of the passive voice to its few useful purposes, such as when you want to emphasize the person or thing acted upon.


### Example

subject — action receives the action

The advertising circulars are distributed by the mail carriers.

## How to recognize the passive voice

Passive sentences always have some form of the verb "to be" (am, is, are, was, were, be, being, been) plus a main verb that usually ends in "-ed." Passive sentences may state who or what performs the action, as in the example above ("by the mail carriers"), but often do not, as in the example below.
