Let the verb show the action: avoid "has the capability to"

Get rid of the phrase "has the capability to." If you must, use "can" in its place, but it's best if you can avoid it.

Example

Poor: Each system has the capability to maintain indoor temperature within the range

of 18°-26°C.

Better: Each system <u>can maintain</u> indoor temperature within the range of 18°–26°C.

Best: Each system maintains indoor temperature within the range of 18°–26°C.
