Write with precision: "its" vs. "it's"

It's like this: its corresponds to his or her and it's is a contraction for it is or it has.

Whereas <u>his</u> and <u>her</u> are the possessive forms of <u>he</u> and <u>she</u>, <u>its</u> is the possessive form of <u>it</u>. Use an apostrophe only if you mean <u>it is</u> or <u>it has</u>.

Examples

The ship provides most of the cargo-handling equipment when <u>it's</u> the crew's responsibility to load or unload the ship. In some cases, <u>it's</u> been necessary to shift cargo after unloading the ship.
