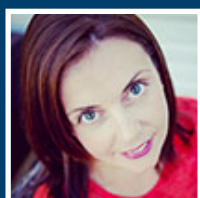

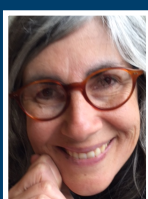

A recent study at BCIT shows that between 25-30% of first-term students feel more confident in a language other than English. This same study also suggests that there are significant differences between students in English reading, vocabulary, and writing skills. Artificial Intelligence in the classroom: Implementation in Health

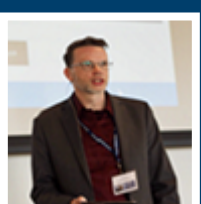

The treasARmap “formula” can be used to provide learners with questions, clues, problems, and location or task-specific resources to guide them through a unique, gamified learning journey. Then, he will discuss how to augment that map with interactive AR layers using a free HP Reveal Studio account.
